

# Explore Historic Halifax

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## Halifax, Nova Scotia

Following the walking route highlighted in blue, you'll discover Halifax's rich history and warm charm with every step. Begin your journey at the Halifax Seaport in Pavilion 22, an open-concept market offering a warm, friendly shopping experience. Right next door is Pier 21 Canada's Immigration Museum, that celebrates and shares Canada's immigration history. Next to Pier 21 is the Mary E. Black Gallery, Nova Scotia's only fine craft public gallery that hosts exhibitions year round. Across from Pavilion 20 is Garrison Brewery, Halifax's largest independent microbrewer. Enjoy one of their handcrafted ales or grab a coffee at the Java Factory Roasting Company. As you stroll along Harbourwalk South, you can sample local food at the new LEED certified Halifax Seaport Farmers' Market.

Continuing along the waterfront, you'll find stylish shops and fine dining just off the boardwalk at Bishop's Landing. Next door, explore our seafaring heritage at the Maritime Museum of the Atlantic. Continuing north, you'll find the heritage buildings of the Historic Properties (with more great shopping and dining) and the non-stop excitement of Casino Nova Scotia.

Heading uphill and west leads you to more charming attractions, including the shops of historic Granville Mall. On Barrington Street, City Hall and historic St. Paul's Anglican Church bracket Grand Parade

square. At the crest of the hill, Halifax Citadel on Brunswick Street stands watch over the city. One of Canada's most visited National Historic Sites, this is the perfect place to discover our military heritage and enjoy panoramic vistas of the city and the harbour beyond. Perched on the side of Citadel Hill, the Old Town Clock is another iconic Halifax landmark, dating back to 1803.

Continue your walk west along Sackville Street and you'll soon reach the Halifax Public Gardens. These fine Victorian gardens are an oasis in the heart of the city—cool off with an ice cream cone, while away a sunny afternoon or enjoy a free Sunday concert at the bandstand. Find more stylish shopping and dining on Argyle Street and Spring Garden Road, where some of the city's finest restaurants, bars and boutiques are popular destinations for locals and visitors alike. A great way to see Halifax's sister city, Dartmouth, is to hop on the ferry for a trip across the world's second largest natural harbour. Wherever you stroll, you're sure to find something to entice you in the compact and bustling downtown of this historic city.

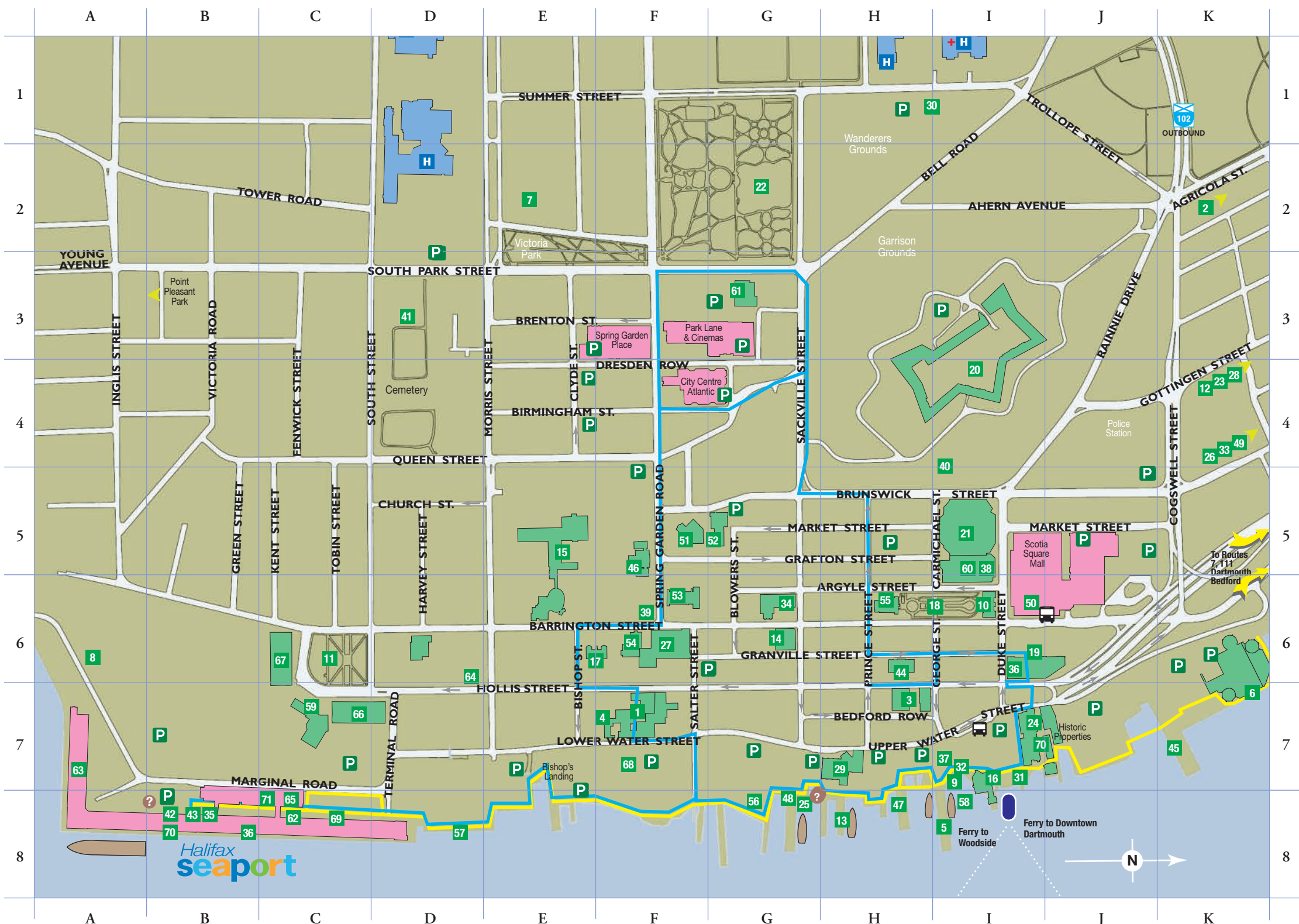
